From April 2 to April 15, 2024

Every year since its beginning in 2006, the Film Festival L'Europe autour de l'Europe has been showcasing European cinema in the heart of the French capital The festival aims to be a place where professionals and the public can meet and exchange ideas, as well as an opportunity to celebrate arthouse and auteur cinema from the wider Europe.

The nineteenth edition of the festival, entitled "Human Faces, Faces of History" will be held from 2 to 15 April 2024 in Paris, and will present a selection of contemporary and heritage films from some twenty countries. The program will includes short and feature-length fiction, documentaries and experimental films, retrospectives, exhibitions, and encounters.

All screenings will be accompanied by the film crews, film professionals and guest speakers on the themes addressed in the films.



World premiere of the Polish documentary *Insurgents! The Resistance Fighters of the Warsaw Ghettos / Insurgées!* By Rafael Lewandowski, in the presence of the director.

World premiere of a singular science-fiction film *Pannes des sens : The Last Investigation of Philipp Marlowe (1980)* by Maurice Ronai et Dominique Chapuis (in the presence of the director Maurice Ronay).
